



15 months ago, over 200 teens gathered for the first time in Golden, CO after the death of Robbie Eckert. We did not have a plan or an agenda, we simply wanted to listen to the people most affected by suicide in our small community, the teens themselves.

What has taken shape over the past 12 months is truly amazing. Thousands of teens regularly engage with Robbie's Hope over social media and through personal activism. Why? Because they are tired of losing their friends to suicide! They are tired of not having a voice! They are passionate about changing the dialog surrounding teen mental health and teen suicide!

A movement, an uprising, of our youth is forming and spreading the simple message that It's Ok to Not Be Ok. We have distributed over 25,000 copies of our Adult Handbook in the past 4 months, a guide by teens on how to talk to teens. Our agenda for year 2 is packed with social activism, legislative reform, and HOPE group expansions. Your personal and financial support is making a difference. 

The Colorado Legislature Including:


A Requirment for Mental Training For Our Teachers,
